"THE CIRCLE."

In attempting to put on this play, we are again conscious of aiming rather higher than we can reach. Indeed, it should be frankly admitted that no amateur company can have the technical accomplishments, necessary for an entirely satisfactory performance of a Comedy of Manners. But, if this is true, it is equally true that one can learn a great deal from such an attempt coupled with a realisation of the difficulties. One of our aims is always to improve our work, and thus our ability to entertain you.

"The Circle" is generally held to be W. Somerset Maugham's masterpiece. His later, more serious-minded works, do not seem to bear quite the same stamp of superb craftsmanship. "The Circle" is as flawless and brilliant as an artificial gem. We use the word "artificial" advisedly, because high comedy is written in an essentially artificial convention, a convention of which Mr. Maugham is a past master.

This artificiality is the keynote to Miss Audrey Perkins' setting, which, with its unrealistic use of screens, attempts to catch both the style and the convention of Mr. Maugham's Play.
