SHAKESPEARE describes this play as a "Tragedy." Is that description just? To many "Macbeth" is "the noisiest play Shakespeare ever wrote," and frankly it seldom achieves a level much higher than melodrama.

This must always be the problem of "Macbeth," and in setting ourselves to overcome it we have at any rate one advantage, namely, an intimate theatre and conditions more nearly akin to Shakespeare's own theatre than the majority of playhouses today. This enables us to pitch the production in a quieter key, and so, we hope, emphasise the play's human values and bring out its tragedy of a human spirit.

That at least has been our aim. To what extent we achieve it the Audience, the Ultimate Arbiter of the Theatre, must decide.

We hope you will come to the discussion on Monday and tell us!

THE ACTION takes place mainly at Forres, Inverness and Dunsinane in Scotland; one scene only being in England.

The play will be given in two parts, with one interval of fifteen minutes.
