A NOTE ON PIRANDELLO

Luigi Pirandello was born in 1867 in Sicily, and died in 1936. He was deeply influenced by that other great Sicilian artist, Giovanni Verga (known to English audiences as the author of "Cavalleria Rusticana").

Much of Pirandello's early work, short stories and novels, is in part a realistic picture of Sicilian life, and throughout his life he wrote, or re-wrote, some of his work in the Sicilian dialect.

Like other Italian artists before him, he moved to Rome and he was there during the first World War where he was encouraged to begin writing plays. RIGHT YOU ARE (IF YOU THINK SO) was one of these earliest plays, its theme being taken from one of Pirandello's short stories. It was not until 1921, after Six Characters in Search of an Author had caused a riot in the theatre at Rome, that there followed a great ovation for the author in Milan. His work was proclaimed as that of a great modern dramatist—part of the new trend in European drama associated with Ibsen, Strindberg, Shaw and Granville Barker.

A European reputation followed—Henry IV, Each In His Own Way and As You Desire Me were translated and performed in America and in this country. More recently, the B.B.C. Third Programme has awakened interest in Pirandello with the revival of several of his plays, and Heinemann, the publishers, have promised in the near future further translations of his plays by Frederick May.
