To you in the audience to-night's performance is just another show which you hope (and we hope) will entertain you. The chief difference between it and our usual productions is that the programme consists of four separate one-act plays and that, as it is an extra-programme production, you will have paid for your seat, even if you are a member. But for the majority of those on the stage it is very much more of an occasion. Three of the plays are presented by the Second Year Student Group, and for these students it is the first time, after nearly eighteen months' work, that they have performed in a play together on the stage of our theatre. For them to-night is a milestone indeed; an event, terrifying yet stimulating, fearful but exciting.

Being a student at the Questors Theatre is no sinecure: three classes a week for a year and at the end of that the chance of not being picked to enter the Second Year Group, which is restricted to twelve members. For a member of the Second Year Group there are four classes a week, with additional rehearsals as the time for the production approaches. "Work" is a fair word to use, and only those with a real interest and enthusiasm can make the grade. Those qualities, at least, to-night's players have.

Against some of the characters in the Students' plays are set the names of two players. In each such case two members of the group have studied and rehearsed the part and will play it on alternate nights. This will allow of interesting comparisons

in interpretation for those who come to two performances.

Of the plays, two are being produced for the first time—both written by members of the Questors. Ned Gethings as a playwright is steadily growing in stature. One of his one-act plays, Tinkers' Idyll, was produced by the Student Group two years ago and a full length play, Strange Echoes, had a reading at a recent Club Night. Other one-act plays of his have been produced by local groups with considerable success. Janet Dunbar, in private life the wife of acting member Clifford Webb, is better known as a writer in other spheres and has recently published a book of valuable advice to radio speakers. The Affected Young Ladies, based of course upon Molière, has been selected by Hugh Miller for inclusion in the next volume of Best One-act Plays. Cocteau's stark and streamlined version of Antigone is almost unknown in this country: a test for any company of actors, it is also a great experience to play in. Shaw's classic one-act piece, Overruled, which makes up the bill, is performed by members of the main acting group.
