REBELLION IN RETROSPECT

The Scythe reaping the harvest of rebellion—the sun setting on the spoils of war are perhaps symbols expressing Denis Johnston's views of rebellion, looking back as he does forty years after the Easter rising in Dublin.

The professional soldier is set among the amateurs of rebellion; the religious man with a definable purpose in life is thrown up against the materialist who realises most deeply its complications; the little man becomes the Galahad of his girl's dreams in a heroic defence of the bridge. With them are found the fool and the fanatic, the sinner and the down to earth official and their story is told against a background of music which makes its own comment on the atmosphere they create.

MacCarthy, throughout the play, is expressing Johnston's conception of the paradox of life.

The mixture we find here is of laughter and tears, light and shade, tension and relaxation and the author's liveliness of dialogue keeps us involved throughout. The choice of music is his own.
