ABOUT THE PLAY

"MISALLIANCE" was first produced at the Duke of York's on February 23rd, 1910, and was described as a debate in one sitting. The "Punch" theatre critic, writing at the time, saw it as "a protracted symposium on just any subject that occurred to anybody." He castigated the author for various examples of bad taste and severely objected to the way in which Shaw seemed to regard himself as an institution and, therefore, a fit subject for ridicule and burlesque.

Today we are, perhaps, much more disposed to accept Shaw as an institution, and to enjoy the spirit of burlesque in which he approaches both himself as a writer, and some of his dearly cherished ideas. Most of us would probably agree with Desmond MacCarthy that "the play is not one of Mr. Shaw's masterpieces, but it exhibits his extraordinary power of blending the utterly fantastic with piercing insight into fact and making discussion so amusing that on the stage it throws most comedies of situation in the shade as an entertainment."
