

The music has been chosen from the works of Teleman, Le Romain, and Boismortier.

The instruments are reproductions of originals used between 1650 and 1750.

The musical research has been carried out by June and Denis Comper and the music has been edited and produced by sound Level Studio. Denis Comper also composed the Ballad in Act One.

The play is a selection of scenes from two plays by Dryden—"The Maiden Queen" and "Marriage a la Mode", made by Colley Cibber who was an actor manager at the turn of the Seventeenth Century. The characters are what you make of them; they were vehicles for the principal actors and actresses of the day, for instance, Nell Gwynne played the original Florimel.

During the construction of the new theatre building all productionss will be given in the Constantin Strauislavsky Room.
