

#### THE SILVER KING

Towards the close of the last century some extremely bad melodramas were being written and played on the London stage; bad, because they relied on sheer sensationalism to score their effect, while workmanlike construction, valid characterisation and a good, well-knit story line were too frequently sacrificed

At The Questors Theatre over the last decade it has been our annual practice to present a melodrama at Christmas time and a tradition of audience participation has been established, enjoyed by actors and patrons alike. The worse the script, the more both producer and actors have felt encouraged to invite the audience to join with them in "sending up" the play, and many riotously entertaining evenings have been the result.

This year's play, however, is not in this category. "The Silver King" is great melodrama, acknowledged as a classic of its kind. Inevitably, in this day and age, the ingenuous language, the contrivance of the situations and the easy recognition of "good" and "bad" cannot but amuse and, indeed, by striving to achieve an acting style consonant with the period in which the play was written we have not hesitated to invite your laughter. More than this, our villains are prepared for, even expect, your hisses, while our tragic wives will welcome your encouragement. This is the stuff of melodrama and has nothing of ridicule in it. We do not mean to mock—we hope you will relish and be entertained.


