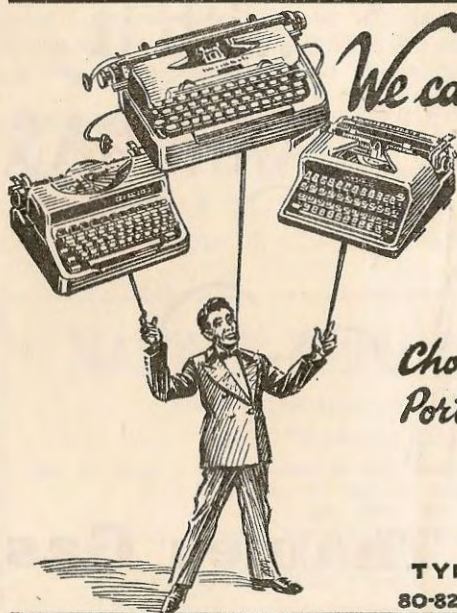

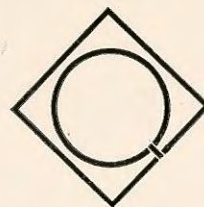

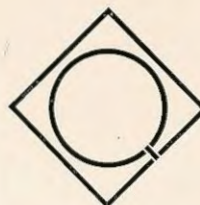

THE WINTER'S TALE is a regenerative tragedy. It begins, like the earlier tragedies — "Othello" and "Hamlet" — with Leontes' rejection of all the qualities of Good (love, truth, fidelity), and his acceptance of the promptings of Evil. But Shakespeare, in Leontes' case, halts the degeneration by his repentance — after the death of his son and the supposed death of his wife. The regenerative process begins with the second half of the play. I think the essence of the play lies in Florizel's lines :-

" for I cannot be
Mine own, nor anything to any, if
I be not thine, to this I am most constant,
Though destiny say no."

There is a spiritual strength in the soul which, accepting love and faith, will overcome evil destiny.


