BUNYAN, GRIMM OR RUNYON ?

J. P. Donleavy was born in New York in 1926.

His best known work is his novel "The Ginger Man," which has also been made into a play. "Fairy Tales of New York" was first performed at the Pembroke Theatre, Croydon in 1961 and subsequently transferred to the Comedy Theatre in January 1962.

The play is a fable, a morality, a cartoon or what you will. Three actors are called upon to play a multiplicity of parts around the central character of Cornelius Christian. Christian's arrival in New York, and his Progress, brings him into contact with several facets of American life, which the author presents in four isolated acts. Donleavy's satirical tone is, however, not the usual harsh bludgeoning of the "in" satirists; rather he presents to the audience his view of the American way of life, death, big business and then invites them to laugh with him. Above all, they are Fairy Tales; there are damsels in distress, dragons, and, at the end, a "Parfait Christian Knighte". And they lived happily, etc. etc.

The exhibition of Art during the run of "Fairy Tales of New York" is the work of Ed Ford who as a member of The Questors has contributed to set designs and acted in productions.
