

#### **COMMENT** .....

"The Father" is a play about a marriage, or the impossibility of a marriage. Even as Strindberg was writing it his own first marriage to the actress, Siri von Essen, was breaking apart. So the miraculous force he gave to the play was the force of an experience being lived there and then.

At the same time, in 1887 when he was setting the play down, the talk in Scandinavia was about women's new freedoms, aided and abetted by Henrik Ibsen. His emotions after seeing "A Doll's House" added to the fury unleashed in "The Father".

Yet curiously, for all his reactionary ideas about women, Strindberg's play seems much more "modern" than Ibsen's. "The Father" has a swiftness of movement and a stark, hard clarity of language that fits the mood of our times precisely. And the way the husband-wife relationship is lifted beyond social document to tragic level is good for all time.


This play will be the first major Strindberg presentation by The Questors.



### THEATRE FOR CHILDREN

The success of the many visits by the Unicorn Theatre for Children in recent months has prompted us to invite another famous company for children to perform at our Theatre. This is Theatre Centre, whose Founder Director, Brian Way, has contributed enormously to the prevalent movement of presenting drama to children so that they feel something more than mere passive audience. He has developed the technique of audience participation to such an extent and so successfully, that to watch his Company perform before children, the onlooking adult is hard put to define where actors end and audience begins (if, that is, one can remain a mere "onlooking adult" and not be drawn in oneself by the magic of the situation). Brian Way feels strongly that a play should be directed at a limited age group and his two plays are, therefore, aimed at different audiences, "The Clown" on February 5th at 11.00 a.m., for 7 - 11 year olds and "Christopher Columbus" on February 25th, also at 11.00 a.m., to 12 - 18 year olds.
