#### THE BEAUX STRATAGEM

The Beaux Stratagem, our choice for the May production, is often thought of as Restoration Comedy, but it is more appropriate to consider it as a play which bridges the artificial, brilliant and often vicious plays of the late 17th Century and the gentler, more sentimental comedies of Goldsmith, Sheridan and their contemporaries. We would like to think that it takes the best of both these theatrical worlds and blends them into a play composed of humour and humanity.

Members may recall William Gaskill's brilliant production of another play of Farquhar's "The Recruiting Officer", at the National Theatre recently, which gave the play a heavily social angle and which owed a great deal to Brecht's adaptation, "Trumpet and Drums" Present day audiences found this much to their taste. We hope that "The Beaux Stratagem" may be given an equally fresh look by placing it in a setting which has an Edwardian flavour and using a number of theatrical devices which have also been associated with the name of Brecht. However, on this occasion we are not so much concerned with the social message as with entertaining our audiences by some delightful characters' romantic and ridiculous experiences. ALAN CHAMBERS


#### THEATRE FOR CHILDREN Age 6 - 12

The World Premiere of THE KENNINGTON LION by Vivienne Pye takes place at The Questors Theatre at 11 a.m. on Saturday May 13th prior to its presentation at The Arts Theatre, London. It will be performed by The Unicorn Theatre for whom it was specially written.

The characters are both exciting and amusing first—Sid, the Holewatchman, and his friend Nellie Bucket; then two workmen, Coughdrop and Butterfingers and their fussy Foreman; Lady Beatrice, the Benefactress; Emily Hoggin, a most unusual and not-at-all frightening ghost; Guy Left-Behind and finally the Kennington Lion himself. The dialogue is lively and the play contains humour pathos and excitement.

Tickets will be on sale after April 1st, price 4/-.





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
