Looked at on the level of facts "The Homecoming" is a play about a family deprived of Mum. She is a felt absence, whose withdrawal from the scene has liberated the men and set them free to prey upon each other.

The menace which overhangs this play is due to Pinter's refusal to offer the audience any information about the forces they feel as hostile. Danger, normally conceived in the future, creates apprehension as the future approaches. In Pinter, the threat is present and immediate, and actions which seem illogical when applied to the future or past and to the world outside seem justifiable when looked at only for the present.

It is in this way that Pinter is able to create terror and suspense in spite of the lack of any definable threat.
