

THE QUESTORS THEATRE FIRST PERFORMANCE Saturday, 10th October, 1970

Written in 1948 by John Whiting, "Conditions of Agreement" was staged for the first time in 1965 at the Bristol Old Vic. The Questors production is only the second time that this fascinating play has been performed. Producing the play has proved to be an illuminating and pleasurable experience which I can only liken to being presented with one vast blank stage and five actors, and told to choreograph a dance of unusual depth, colour and situation, without music. Masks are provided, and each character changes masks when changing partners, as to each a different aspect must be presented. Take: one retired clown, one widow, one ageing grocer (known only by his initials), the widow's son, and his wife who was born a bastard, and attempt to dance a quadrille. Then add: one well-structured plot, imaginative dialogue, touches of savage humour, sprinke gently with pathos, and the perhaps entertaining result is "Conditions of Agreement."

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

The living room of Mrs. Doon's house in a small town near Oxford. Time is the present. It is the afternoon of a Thursday in September.


ACT TWO SCENE ONE The same, three days later, that is the Sunday. It is ten-thirty in the morning.


