



#### PROGRAMME NOTE FOR OTHELLO

Othello is presumed to have been written in 1604 and the main source of the play was a short story by Giraldi Sinthio which was published in Venice in 1566. As no English translation is known before 1753, it could be conjectured that Shakespeare knew enough Italian to be able to read the original, or that he had read the French translation which was published in Paris in 1584.

The play itself has come down to us in two Quartos and the Folio. The first Quarto was printed in 1622 nearly 20 years after the first performance, the Folio in 1623, and the second Quarto is 1630. These three versions have given rise to a large amount of textual commentary and emendation. The Folio contains 160 lines which are not in the first Quarto and there are also several errors or misprints in that Quarto.

The "double-time" theory has always been a point of controversy. The dialogue indicates that a considerable length of time has passed in Cyprus before Othello takes the extreme step, but the playing time takes place over some 33 hours. Bianca's line "What, keep a week away?" to Cassio is the principle time "lapse" in the play. Many critics have praised Shakespeare for his subtle use of "double time"; others are of the opinion that he wrote the play so quickly for immediate presentation that the errors stayed in, just as he had written them, and were never corrected.






