#### MINACK AND BACK . .

Bringing a production back from the Minack Theatre in Cornwall for presentation at The Questors is an exciting venture. The prospect of staging a modern, somewhat claustrophobic indoor play in modern dress against the backdrop of the swelling Atlantic, was a daunting one. Lists of previous productions marched back into history—epic plays, costume dramas, large casts and there we were—seven cast and seventy feet of stone and grass stage to contend with. Strangely enough "for once the scenic background disappeared and the world became a stage." An immensely enjoyable experience.

To return to the warm quiet womb of The Questors is, by comparison, a luxury which must be treated gently: rarely do actors have the chance to recreate their characters in a different climate, with completely different stimuli. No gales to blow the voice away, no seaguils, no bats, no stray dogs on stage eating the property sandwiches under their very noses during a sunny matinée; nothing but the friendly dark of a theatre in which to explore the dialogue anew.
