



When Laius succeeded his father Labdacus as King of Thebes, he married Jocasta. It was prophesied by an oracle that the son of such a union would kill his father and marry his mother, so Laius spurned Jocasta and she, in revenge, made him drunk and they conceived a son. Laius took the child from Jocasta at birth and exposed the infant on the slopes of Mount Cithaeron, piercing its feet with a nail and tying them together.

But a shepherd found the child and carried it to the King of Corinth, Polybus, whose marriage was childless. He and his Queen, Merope, adopted the child and called it Oedipus because of its foot-wounds. As a young man Oedipus heard the prophecy of the oracle, and to spare his supposed mother and father he left Corinth and took the road to Thebes. On the journey, at a crossroads, he met an old man in a chariot. They guarrelled and Oedipus killed him. It was Laius. When Oedipus reached Thebes, the city was in thrall to the Sphynx, a creature with a woman's head, the body of a lion, and the wings of a bird, who guarded the approach to the city. Every traveller had to answer the riddle of the Sphynx and none had succeeded. The bones of the dead lay everywhere around Oedipus as the riddle was pronounced. "What has four legs in the morning, two-legs in the afternoon and three legs in the evening; and is weakest when it has the most?" Oedipus delivered the answer: "Man; who crawls on all fours as a baby, walks upright in the prime of life, and uses astick in his old age". Defeated, the Sphynx leapt from her rock and fell into the sea.

The people of Thebes rejoiced, feted Oedipus, and, because their King had recently been murdered by an unknown person, he married their Queen. It was Jocasta.

A plaque then descended upon Thebes. Creon, Jocasta's brother, was sent to the oracle to discover what the Thebans must do to avert their destruction.
