

The Tragedy of

Date

The play was probably written around 1608; certainly towards the end of Shakespeare's writing career. It contains several references to the events of that period and the verse has

many similarities to those works which we term as his 'late plays'.

Source

The tragedy is taken from the writings of Plutarch, an historian who wrote the biographies of many great Romans and Greeks. These were written around 100 A.D. and were translated into English by Sir Robert North in 1579.

Plot

The action moves between Rome, Corioli and Antium, long before Rome could be regarded as a world power—probably around 400 B.C.

Caius Martius is a Roman general who, for his deeds in a victorious battle against the Volsces, is named Coriolanus.

An attempt by his friends to have him elected Consul upon his return to Rome, is thwarted by the newly elected Tribunes to the People, Sicinius and Brutus. They incite the citizens against him and he is banished from the city.

In revenge, he joins his old enemy Tullus Aufidius and leads an army to the walls of Rome. His friends and family are sent to him to plead for mercy; finally his mother prevails and he decides not to attack the city itself.

Tullus Aufidius, then incites the Volscian people against him and Coriolanus is killed.
