

Because Coward poured so much of himself into the play we are fortunate that it was written at the height of his powers in 1943. Had it been written ten years later it might have lacked something, for Coward never completely came to terms with an the post-war world. His hero, Garry Essendine, found even the 'wireless' vulgar. No wonder his creator did not entirely fit in with a world dominated increasingly by the television and cheap music. The play was written in the middle of the war in 1943, but obviously harks back to the halcyon days before the war when famous actors such as Coward and Ivor Novello made the Ivy Restaurant the headquarters of a gay, sparkling theatrical set. One feels Coward is putting into Present Laughter all his reaction to the dreariness of war. The result is witty, frothy, and immensely theatrical, for this is essentially a play about the Theatre in which Coward achieves the almost impossible feat of making his characters both realistic and larger-than-life at the same time.

The first performance was at the Haymarket Theatre, in 1947, but I have set this production in 1939, surely the year Coward was looking back to when he wrote it.
