

## THE RECRUIT

### First Performance: SATURDAY, 10th MAY, 1975

George Farquhar's play was first performed at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane on 8th April 1706. It is a play that marks a movement away from the crueller, heartless world of true Restoration comedy for there is a mellower, more tolerant attitude throughout it. The characters care for each other. Sylvia and her father enjoying a friendship based on mutual trust, her provision for Plume's bastard, Bullock's concern for his sister, Plume and Ballance's respect for each other, are all examples of a kinder feeling pervading the atmosphere.

Basing his play on his own experiences recruiting in Shrewsbury in Autumn 1704 Farquhar was able to move his action into the country. His portraits from real life of all levels of country society are sympathetically drawn and allow us to see the impact of the eruption of the military into the rural setting. The methods used to recruit at that time were, to say the least, dubious and the play shows us some of this. However, Farquhar does not press the moral issue being more concerned to amuse the audience. Nevertheless we cannot entirely avoid the sharp questions that some of the situations present. It is apposite to note that Brecht adapted the play as 'Pauken und Trumpeten' and set it in the War of American Independence as a means of showing his own indignation at class exploitation. In the successful National Theatre production of 1963 William Gaskill did more than touch his cap in the direction of Brecht and certainly there is a temptation to stress a class theme in the way the play is directed. I hope that this production has resisted that temptation and presented as balanced and truthful a picture as Farquhar tried to do of his 'friends around the Wrekin' without adopting a moral posture.

The production has drawn upon tradition by inserting songs into the text—a device which Farquhar encouraged for he wrote two himself and there are records of extra songs being used in a performance as early as 1710.
