Edna St.Vincent Millay (1892-1950), was one of America's best-loved poets. She was the first woman to win America's top literary award, the Pullitzer Prize for her poem "The Ballad of the Harp Weaver" (1922) In 1927 she was commissioned by the Metropolitan Opera to write the libretto for a native opera by Deems Taylor, "The King's Henchman". Millay wrote six additional verse plays for the stage, of which "Aria Da Capo" was written in 1919.
