Programme Note

This Italian word (lazzi)..... serves to designate all sorts of burlesque pleasantries either in words, play on words, action, grimaces, grotesque gestures, etc.... The lazzi are characterised if not by coarse humour at least by a certain vulgarity; it is comedy without distinction, real buffoonery which has little wit to it, but inevitably gives an effect of surprise and laughter. The comedians of the Hôtel de Bourgogne in the old days, as well as Turlupin and the like, were famous for their lazzi; Molière did not disdain to employ them in his wonderful comedies, and more than one actor since has owed a part of his reputation to them.

'Le Dictionnaire du théâtre' by Arthur Pougin (1885)

This word, meaning 'knots' ('lazzi' being the Lombardian expression for the Tuscan 'Lacci'), is used to denote scenes wherein the buffoons interrupt the story with irrelevant pranks — scenes of a kind which Shakespeare wrote for his clowns in order to relieve the tensity of his plots, and which in England were called 'jigs'.

Molière was indebted to the commedia dell'arte not only for the movement with which he imbued his plays, but also for various plots, scenes, episodes, stage business, intrigues, and characters. 'The Italian Comedy' by Pierre Louis Duchartre (1929)

Certainly the plays of Moliere were the finest fruit of the Commedia dell'Arte.

The Grapevine Club continues as a private bar.


