"COLUMPANUS"


At the end of the seventh century the Irish Celts, now Christians, blazed into history with their own special brand of the Christian ideal. It spread like a fire across the British Isles and into Gaul where it came into direct conflict with the remains of the Roman civilisation (the Church in Rome at its head) whose hope of survival, confronted and surrounded by by barbarians as they were, depended on utilising what remained of the late Empire's organisation, and charging it with this new spirit and fire. The Roman Christians needed the fire. The Celtic Christians (from Ireland), untroubled by the barbarians and untouched in their own land by the great Roman Empire even at its height, needed nothing. They were not concerned with central organisation or even survival, but only with the fire that burned in their souls.

COLUMBANUS, an Irish monk trained at Bangor (N. Ireland), was typical of his age. A strong, resolute and uncompromising evangelist, he exiled himself in middle age, like Columba before him, arrived in Gaul, made converts, founded monasteries (one of them at Luxeuil in Burgundy), and with all the sincerity in the world infuriated the French and finally earned the hatred of a remarkable woman of her time, the Christian Queen Brunhilde of the Franks. She too, though advanced in years, was tough and resolute (before the Irish abbot became established, she had buried a murdered husband and son, and for 25 years acted as Regent for her two young grandsons). Her great ambition was to weld together the divided Franks and make an Empire (France) ruled by her line. COLUMBANUS and his ideals got in her way. Because of his reputation and fame, however, she could not remove him in the usual manner, i.e. by murder or imprisonment, so she carefully planned working at first through her grandson, King Theodoric, already under a holy man's wing - and campaigned to rid herself of the aged but still powerful Abbot of Luxeuil.




