TURNING POINT

Since 1945, scientific and technological advances have finally realized many of of the Ancient's dreams. And this we do also: we have consultations, which of the inventions and experiences which we have discovered shall be published, and which not: and take all an oath of secrecy for the concealing of those which we think fit to keep secret: though some of those we do reveal sometimes to the State, and some not."
