


THE CAGE BIRDS

DIRECTOR'S NOTE: David Campton's plays are too numerous to mention. They range, in his own words, from 'domestic comedy, through costume melodrama to comedy of menace'.

The Cage Birds is a comedy of menace. Six characters in a cage, each one totally absorbed in her own particular characteristics, are suddenly thrown into panic by the inclusion of the wild one — a character from the outside world. Why birds? — Do we not all at times pigeon-hole ourselves?

'The worst kind of death where the spirit dies first and the husk goes on clack — clack — clacking after'. There are parasites that eat their victims from within until nothing is left but the

outer skin. All that remains is a parody of life'.

Do you want that to happen to you?

THE TRIAL

DIRECTOR'S NOTE: Steven Berkoff is an actor and theatre director as well as a playwright. His first original play in 1975 was East which won him critical acclaim. His other work now includes, Greek, West, Decadence and other adaptations of both Kafka and Edgar Allen Poe.

His work fuses all the elements of drama into a whole experience. It is earthy, physical, musical and surreal, combining both the language of the body and the spoken word — very exciting, not only for the audience but also for the director and the actors.

Let a few of Berkoff's own words introduce his two-act play:

'It is a diary of a no-one, the diary of the oppressed'

'Kafka expressed me, as I expressed Kafka'

K's guilt . . . is the guilt of betrayal: the guilt of betraying his inner spirit to the safety of mediocrity'

'To create a metaphysical concept is to condense reality into its

surreal intense image'

Nine screens, nine chairs and a rope are the set. The screens are the structure of the city — they are a maze and a trap — they are external and internal worlds — they are 'K's' route as well as his death.

New and Prospective Members evenings are held every WEDNESDAY, commencing at 7.45pm in the Grapevine bar. Included in the programme will be a comprehensive tour of the acting areas, workshops, wardrobe and rehearsal space.

THE STUDENT GROUP

The first Questors Student Training Course for Actors was started in 1947. A new Group has been formed every year since then, to run under the same direction. This is a 2-Year Course, aimed at giving preliminary training for amateur actors and preparing them for membership of the main acting group of The Questors Theatre. Between 20 and 24 students are generally enrolled for the First Year Course, selected by audition from some 60 applicants. At the end of the first year, there is a further process of selection to make up the Second Year Group, whose final production you are seeing this evening.

The Course makes great demands on the Students. In the first year there are 5½ hours of classes every week for 36 weeks, including Speech, Movement, Acting and Make-up. In the second year, the intensity of work steps up greatly, with 7½ hours of regular classes each week and many hours of additional rehearsals for the two productions given by the Group during the year, the first of which was the programme of short plays given in the Studio Theatre in February.

The Course therefore demands a very high standard of commitment and enthusiasm and a great sense of loyalty to the Group. Without that, a student will not make the grade, but with it, will learn how to make a valuable and rewarding contribution to the life of the theatre. More than one third of the present acting members of The Questors had their initial training in our Student Group.

The Training Course is run under the auspices of the Ealing Education Committee. A new Second Year Group is now being formed from those who have just completed their first year and applications are being invited for the new First Year Course to start in September.

The minimum age for the Student Course is 18. The Questors also run an 'Introductory Group' for 17-year olds, likewise selected by audition. For this, the class time is only 3 hours per week, but the personal committment to the Group is just as high.
