

ÖDÖN VON HORVÁTH was an Austro-Hungarian novelist and dramatist, born in 1901. His first plays were produced by Max Reinhardt, and received instant acclaim in Germany. The plays which have become more widely known in Britain through the adaptations of playwright Christopher Hampton include Tales From The Vienna Woods and Don Juan Comes Back From The War. The novel on which Cold Times is based presents what Stefan Zweig has described as 'the most realistic picture of the generation which grew up during the despairing years after the First World War'.

Jugend ohne Gott is a beautifully written novel dealing with the nature and effect of a totalitarian state. The language is simple and direct yet the ideas and range of issues covered are complex and far reaching. The teacher could represent any of us in such circumstances, initially prepared to compromise, succumbing to his own fears and inadequacies yet finally, when faced with lies and injustice, redeeming himself by telling the truth and recovering his self respect. This redemption is vital and seems to express von Horváth's feelings on the ultimate outcome of such times, and these are emphasised in perhaps his final piece of work. He died in extraordinary circumstances: sheltering from a storm in the Champs Elysées in 1938, a gust of wind broke a rotten branch of a tree which struck him, killing him instantly. The following poem was found in his pocket:

> And people will say In far away blue days It will become clear What is false and what is true

What is false will perish Although it rules today What is true shall come — Although it dies today
