

### THE NORMAN CONQUESTS

Under the umbrella title of "The Norman Conquests", three separate plays recount the events of a single weekend. We eavesdrop on the things which happen to, and the conversations that take place among, the same six characters between 5.30pm on Saturday and something after 9.00am on Monday.

Each play is complete in itself to the extent that an audience leaving the theatre after seeing any one of the three will be fully apprised of the circumstances that led to the assembling of the characters on Saturday and the events that occurred between then and their dispersing on Monday. But — according to which one is seen, they will witness only those scenes that take place in the dining room, or the sitting room, or the garden: what happens in the other two places is reported, but not seen.

The three plays do not form a trilogy, but a triptych: the action is not consecutive but simultaneous; the characters are moving about the house and garden in various groupings throughout the week end.

Thus by seeing only one play, nothing is lost; but enjoyment can be greatly increased by seeing all three — in whatever arrangement, — the order is immaterial.

To give a comprehensive analysis of how the various parts of the action and dialogue dovetail together is not possible in a limited space, but for general interest, the following very broad outline may be helpful

Saturday 5.30pm Round and Round the Garden starts.

6.00pm Table Manners starts.

6.30pm Living Together starts, immediately consecutive to Act I, Scene 1 of Round and Round the Garden.

Table Manners Act I, Scene 1 and Living Together Act I, Scene 1 then run more or less concurrently until

8.00pm when Living Together Act 1, Scene 2 starts followed at

9.00pm by Round and Round the Garden, Act I, Scene 2.

Sunday 9.00am Table Manners Act I, Scene 2 takes place, followed at

11.00am by Round and Round the Garden Act II, Scene 1, there is then quite a gap until

8.00pm when we see Table Manners Act II, Scene 1 followed at

9.00pm by Living Together Act II, Scene 1.

Monday 8.00am Table Manners Act II, Scene 2 and Living Together Act II, Scene 2 run concurrently and the sequence is rounded off at

9.00am by Round and Round the Garden Act II, Scene 2.
