





A TRIBUTE

Our current production is offered as a tribute to Sir Michael on the fifth anniversary of his death. He served as a much-loved President of The Questors for 27 years from 1958 to 1985, by far the longest-serving President in our theatre's history and he was very much more than a figurehead throughout the period. He attended all the key events which marked the planning, building, inauguration and celebration of the Playhouse, culminating in his attendance, although by then very ill, at our Golden Jubilee in 1979. He received a standing ovation at the end of that performance (of *The Beggar's Opera*). His last appearance here was at a joint birthday party given by The Questors for him and Alfred Emmet, on the first night of *A Month in the Country* in 1982, a play chosen because of Sir Michael's long association with it throughout his career.

Sir Michael remains very dear in our hearts and we are glad it has been possible finally to mount a proper theatrical tribute to him. We are therefore especially delighted that Sir Michael's widow, Rachel Kempson, will be appearing in the production. Miss Kempson is of course no stranger to The Questors — she has attended many functions with Sir Michael over the years — but this will be the first time that she has acted on our stage.

She mainly uses the medium of Batik but has recently been experimenting with various print-making techniques. Her work ranges from representational to abstract and is much influenced by a love of nature.
