



Eduardo de Filippo was one of the greatest actors of his day and Saturday, Sunday, Monday (1959) is an actor's play. It doesn't call for a clever directorial concept or wacky design, but relies upon the skill of the actors to portray its delightful characters with honesty and enjoyment. That involves not only finding the emotional life of the characters but also their "Italianness".

It may be a naturalistic play, but this is Italian naturalism — a fabulous creature marrying truth and theatricality. The peculiarities of this creature dictated the choice of the round: the actors can more easily explore a heightened and bolder style of playing, movement and gesture and be honest in their physical relations to each other because they don't have to cheat the angles of their performance.

Ann Fitzgerald was born on the 31st December 1965. An early interest in art was encouraged by her mother who was both a teacher and a painter.

She completed a Foundation Course at Farnham College of Art in 1985 and went on to do a degree in Fine Art at Newcastle University (1985 - 1989) where she specialised in painting. Whilst at University she became fascinated by the light and colour in the paintings by the 15th century artist Piero della Francesca, visiting Tuscany on a number of occasions to study his work. An additional influence has stemmed from her work with young children whose bold use of colour and freedom of expression has become an important source of inspiration. The paintings in this exhibition show a variety of responses to her continuing fascination with the effect of light and colour on her immediate surroundings.
