
### THE TYPISTS

### VACLAV HAVEL

Vaclav Havel was born in Prague on 5th October 1936. He enjoyed a comfortable childhood, remembering himself young as a 'well-fed piglet', but his bourgeois origins made him ineligible for formal higher education during the Stalinist period. However, while employed in a chemical laboratory he went to evening classes and matriculated in 1954.

After military service Havel was variously a man of the theatre, a dissident, a brewery worker and, for four or more years, a prisoner. He practised and reflected on politics, writing many essays which were published in samsizdat form and he eventually became one of the most influential members of the Charter 77 movement.

His first play was performed at the Theatre on the Balustrade in 1963. *Temptation* was written in 1986, following Havel's release after a long term in prison and before the momentous events of 1989 had really begun to brew.

The 29th December, 1989, saw this extraordinary man elected to the Presidency of Czechoslovakia.

Temptation is very much a play of our times. Most appropriately for the Questors' European season it is a variation on the Faust legend — one of the key themes of European literature, which has fascinated writers from Marlowe to Goethe to Thomas Mann. Havel had this potent theme in mind in his early years in prison. On his release he came back to it to use it as a kind of exuberant trampoline from which to bounce his lively and perceptive comments on life in pre-1989 Czechoslovakia.

Temptation is a fascinating mixture of meticulously observed realism and disturbingly credible fantasy. Like The Questors declared policy, it is 'bold, brave and exciting'. At the same time it is very lively and very funny.

It was performed at The Other Place, Stratford on Avon in 1987, but for many of us this Questors production can be seen as a first. A Havel play in our programme may be long overdue, but now, in 1992, while we enjoy this witty and brave play in its own right, we can also enjoy the extra resonance that hind-sight gives us, having seen something of the events in Czechoslovakia which the author himself so significantly helped to bring about.

Havel has said that what pleases him most is when something happens which should happen in all art, namely "that the work of art somehow exceeds its author or is, so to speak, cleverer than he is; and that through the mediation of the writer, no matter what purpose he was consciously pursuing, some deeper truth about his time reveals itself and works its way to the surface".

We hope we have done justice to Havel's intention.
