

# A CHORUS OF DISAPPROVAL

The Beggar's Opera opened in January 1728 at the play-house in Lincoln's Inn Fields. A sardonic, highly original vision of eighteenth century society it was a huge success then and has been revived regularly ever since.

A Chorus of Disapproval opened in May 1984 at the Theatre in the Round, Scarborough and was then presented in the Olivier at the National Theatre in 1985.

Alan Ayckbourn, that complete man of the theatre, started his career as actor / stage manager in Donald Wolfit's company. He has upward of fifty plays to his credit — at one time five of them were running simultaneously in London. He is an accomplished director of his own, and others', plays.

In the interval of the performance of A Chorus of Disapproval on Saturday, 12th November, a Plaque will be unveiled in the Lower Foyer to commemorate the generous bequest made to The Questors by the late Jimmie and Ann Hazelhurst, long standing members of our theatre.
