The most evil passion is our passion for consumption, grasping things for selfsurvival, and this includes carnal love, for that's a passion for consumption, seizure, one person using another for selfish purposes. Man consumes everything without restraint, without control. Animals have their fill thev restrain, but man never. Man is insatiable, he cannot restrain, and that is the ruin of all mankind. Man annihilates all for his wellbeing. Universal restraint is all, if man and humanity are to survive. Perhaps, as I see it, the essence of Christ's teaching lies in this. The prophecy will be accomplished if these passions are destroyed. If humanity's goal is achieved. As long as mankind exists, it faces an ideal. Not the ideal of rabbits and pigs: to multiply: not the ideals of monkeys and Parisians: to derive sexual pleasure, nor the ideal of plucking flowers for pleasure; but selflessness, chastity by restraint, and purity. for which people have constantly strived."
