

PROGRAMME NOTES

Hysteric (his-ter-ik) n, -al pertaining to, of the nature of, or affected with, hysterics or hysteria; fitfully and violently emotional: (hysterical) extremely funny (coll.)

"The purposes of jokes can easily be reviewed. Where a joke is not an aim in itself-that is where it is not an innocent one-there are only two purposes that it may serve... It is either a hostile joke (serving the purpose of aggressiveness, satire, or defence) or an obscene joke (serving the purpose of exposure)."

"We know what is meant by 'smut': the intentional bringing into prominence of sexual facts and relations by speech... It is a further relevant fact that smut is directed to a particular person, by whom one is sexually exited and who, on hearing it, is expected to become aware of the speaker's excitement and as a result to become sexually excited in turn. Instead of this excitement the other person may be led to feel shame or embarrassment, which is only a reaction against the excitement and in a roundabout way, is an admission of it... It cannot be doubted that the desire to see what is sexually exposed is the original motive of smut."

"We are now prepared to realise the part played by jokes in hostile aggressiveness. A joke will allow us to exploit something ridiculous in our enemy which we could not, on account of obstacles in the way, bring forward openly or consciously; once again then the joke will evade restrictions and open sources of pleasure that have become inaccessible."


