THE BIBLICAL SOURCE

So much of what we understand as the 'bible story' comes from a range of sources and traditions.

For this play, I have returned to four Gospels and The Acts of the Apostles.

This creates some surprises, particularly around the character of Mary Magdalene, about whom very little is written in the Bible.

Although I have taken a few liberties in the interests of dramatic convenience, such as setting the wedding feast in Bethany rather than Cana, most of the scenes have their basis in verses from the New Testament.

The importance of Bethany, as Jesus' base near Jerusalem, is clear from the Gospels. It is also the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. In John's Gospel in particular, this family plays a crucial role in the story.

In other Gospels, the woman who anoints the feet of Jesus is not named, but John makes it clear that it is Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus. And she is clearly a different character from Mary Magdalene.

Luke also sets Bethany as the place of the Ascension. I have taken this prominence to set many scenes in Martha's kitchen.

Most of the principal roles are named after characters in the Bible. I have created two characters who are not in the Bible, Rebecca and Amos, but whose actions were clearly part of the drama.


