

CHEKHOV ON WRITING

Why write that a person gets into a submarine and goes to the North Pole to seek some sort of reconciliation with humanity, while at the same time the woman he loves huds breself from a befire with a theatrical shrink? All this is untrue and does not happen in real life. One must write simply — about how ploy Semyonovich agot married to Marya Vanonova, that's all.

In real life people don't spend every minute shooting each other, hanging themsolves and making cordissions of leve. They don't spend all the time saying cleer strips. They're more occupied with earning, dinking, flirting and talking stupiditios—and those are the things which ought to be shown on the stage. A play should be written in which people arrive, go away, tawa dinner, talk about the weather and obly cords. Life must be exactly as it is, and people as they are — not an sitiss. Let everything on the stage be just as complicated, and at the same just as simple, as it is in file. People out their dinner, just eat their dinner, and all the time their happiness is being stabilished or their lives are being broken up.

I began 'The Seaguil' in forte and ended in planissimo - contrary to all the rules of dramatic art.
