

## Improbable Fiction

'If this were played upon a stage now, I could condemn it as an improbable fiction' – Twelfth Night, Act III Scene 4

I met and fell in love with *Improbable Fiction* in 2006, at the Theatre Royal, Bath. It was the new Ayckbourn on its regional tour, I was a Creative Writing MA student at Bath Spa University. Of all the valuable things I learned that year, the most important was the life lesson of this play.

The Pendon Writers' Circle spend most of their meeting explaining to each other why they haven't done any writing and how great that writing would be, had they actually done it. A few have managed to bring work to share: some of it overwritten, some incomprehensible, one just the pictures. Through this work in progress (or lack of progress) we see the rivalries, dreams and hang-ups that both inform their fictional worlds and stop them completing them. What happens at the end of the meeting – and of act one – is theatrically spine-tingling; spookier by far is walking away with the self-knowledge this ostensibly light comedy punches into the would-be writer, or indeed the would-be anything else.

Writer, director, master of structure, commentator of social niceties and nastiness, Ayckbourn is also the first to say you shouldn't have to buy the programme to understand the play (he also says most people only read this stuff in bed afterwards anyway). You won't need programme notes to tell you that here but for the grace of God go all of us: that the immediacies in life can overshadow the important; that the achingly articulate tragedy in the light comedy is of lessons unlearned and lives unchanged; that the way to achieve your goal, literary or otherwise, is to dare to begin – and to keep going.
