

Measure for Measure

'There is scarce truth enough alive to make societies secure, but security enough to make fellowships accursed. Much upon this riddle runs the wisdom of the world. This news is old enough, yet it is every day's news' (Act III Sc 2.) And so it is. This challenging play takes on justice, social breakdown, government, sexual passion and our self-government. It is 'Of all the plays ... the one which bears in it most clearly and unmistakeably the impress of Shakespeare's mind and outlook' (Caroline Spurgeon; Shakespeare's Imagery, 1935). It is strange, ambiguous and morally indeterminate. Does Act V resolve the questions that Shakespeare raises or does the Duke cobble together a typically modern compromise which gives something to everyone but concludes nothing? Our ending might even hint at a different path. And the nihilistic figure of Barnadine, a Shakespearean master stroke in a handful of lines, might be his real answer to the complex and troubling problems of the world. Or perhaps it is the ubiquitous Provost, whose humanity never wavers. But Shakespeare is Shakespeare - his claustrophobic world includes pimps, brothel keepers, constables, hangmen and frivolous dilettantes who find humour in the face of the collapse of their society. We may add a little of our own.


