



ALBION

ALBION

Mike Bartlett's play *Albion* was called a 'state of the nation' play by critics when it was first performed at the Almeida Theatre, London, in October 2017, less than 18 months after the BREXIT vote ⁽¹⁾. The play itself only ran for six weeks but had a huge impact, scoring multiple four- and five-star reviews, as well as earning many of its actors nominations for key awards – Victoria Hamilton winning the 2017 Critics' Circle Theatre Award for Best Actress for her performance as Audrey.

The play was revived remarkably quickly, coming back to the Almeida for a four-week run in February 2020. On the short gap from initial staging to revival, Rupert Goold (*Albion* Director and Artistic Director of the Almeida) said that, "Plays, like plants, grow over time. Their meaning shifts." Britain's departure from the EU inevitably changes the way this play is received.

Albion started life as an idea Bartlett had while writing Earthquakes of London; a garden made the perfect contrast with a slower pace of life. Whilst Earthquakes was set in a city with the fast pace of urban life, a garden in the country would feel rural, less rushed, having a more Chekhovian construction. Whilst the setting and feel for the play existed, Bartlett lacked the context until the BREXIT vote in 2016 when the garden began to become more of a metaphor – it all felt very British and it seemed like a fertile place to write a story. Bartlett notes, "People like gardens. It's a sort of neutral place to tell a story about identity and what it means to be British." Bartlett intentionally didn't set out to attack either side or write a play that features caricatures of those voters (he lets one of his characters do that – look out for Katherine's book!). Instead, he wanted to try and find a bit of common ground to explore some of the ideas that drove voters in their decision.

Bartlett was born in 1980 in Oxford, probably not far from where this play is set. He studied English and Theatre at the University of Leeds. He had considerable early success, becoming Writer in Residence at the Royal Court in 2007, producing several plays and winning several awards – the most famous of which is probably *Cock* in 2009 which won the Laurence Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in an Affiliate Theatre. Bartlett had his first production staged at the National Theatre in 2010 – the aforementioned *Earthquakes in London* directed by Rupert Goold. Perhaps his most well-known piece, *Charles III*, was staged at the Almeida in 2014 before transferring on, with *Albion* arriving in 2017.

As an aside (and as The Questors is hosting a Dr Who event early next year to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the show) Mike Bartlett joined the list of playwrights who've written for *Doctor Who*, in 2017 writing an episode in Peter Capaldi's last season called *Knock, Knock*. Other playwrights who've written for *Doctor Who* include Vinay Patel, Joy Wilkinson and Rona Munro. Bartlett has fast become a favourite at The Questors, having staged *Charles III* in 2019, *Bull* straight after lockdown in 2021 and now *Albion* in 2023.

Bringing this play into the rehearsal room has been an interesting experience – whilst we've touched on the themes, metaphors and inspiration around the writing of the play, most of it doesn't really inform the playing of the text. Whilst one character might notionally represent a more conservative point of view, or another a progressive perspective, what we care about in the rehearsal room is much more about whom the person is, what they want and how they are going about achieving it – the nuts and bolts of their character progression. The metaphor itself drops away into the background and is left to you, the audience to see should you wish.

Finally, there is a wonderful note at the bottom of the page at the start of the script just before the opening of Act 1. It says, "This text went to the press before the end of rehearsals and so may differ slightly from the play as performed." I was fortune enough to see the production at the Almeida back in 2017 and, whilst I don't remember it well, I had the distinct feeling that there were definitely odd bits here that I didn't remember and felt sure that if they had been played as written in the text they would have stuck in my mind. Now — we've done the text exactly as it is written, including those moments so, if you did see the original, see if anything leaps out to you as odd or different, and if you want find out if you're right, find me in the bar later! Once the show is finished, I will get hold of a copy of the production at the Almeida (it was filmed!) and watch it to see if I'm right...

(1) A few weeks ago, someone said to me, "How far do you think you'll get through the Director's Notes before you say BREXIT?" Barely 33 words, it turns out.

Biographies

She debuted with The Questors in 2009 as Harriet in Arthur Miller's *Broken Glass* and, after a long hiatus, appeared as a Mary in *Maryland*, as Gayle/Laura in *Consent* and as Kate in *There*, part of the 2023 Questors *Work in Process* series of short plays.

John Dobson - Matthew

Jenny Richardson - Costume Designer


