We also have courses for those wishing to direct. The Questors has a high standard of acting and, to maintain this, everyone wanting to act must first take an audition. These are held every month – call the Theatre Office for details of forthcoming auditions.

EMMA

IN WALPOLE PARK

Welcome to The Questors Theatre's first outdoor production since lockdown! Walpole Park, against the backdrop of Pitzhanger Manor, is to become our new theatre space. In the golden glow of (hopefully!) a classic English summer evening, we bring you a fresh, contemporary and thoroughly joyful take on Jane Austen's *Emma*. And not just any version of *Emma*, but the gloriously funny, cheekily modern stage adaptation by comedians Doon Mackichan (*Smack the Pony*) and Martin Millar. If ever a novel was ripe for the rom-com treatment, it's this one – and we've absolutely leaned into it. Unapologetic romantic comedy in all its matchmaking, misstepping, mischief-making glory.

2025 marks the 250th anniversary of Jane Austen's birth – a perfect opportunity to celebrate one of the most beloved, most enduring and most delightfully incisive writers in the English language. Her novels have been pored over in classrooms, adapted in every earnest (and not-so-earnest) way imaginable, and reimagined for screens and stages alike. But there's something incredibly satisfying about bringing her wit and wisdom out into the open air – where her characters can breathe, flirt, reprimand and banter just as they were always meant to.

Emma holds a special place in my heart for its humour: the sharp wit, the playful misunderstandings, the larger-than-life characters and the deliciously tangled web of social interactions. It is, in my humble opinion, the Austen novel with the biggest comedic heart. The characters are larger than life, and the social satire razor-sharp but never cruel. With Mackichan and Millar's script – full of clever anachronisms and comic timing – it sparkles even brighter. This version is fast-paced, funny and full of playful self-aware nods to the modern world that never overshadow the story's soul. It's Austen turned up a notch and it's been an absolute joy to bring to life.

This show has not been a small undertaking for our cast of eight. With almost double the number of named characters to actors, character doubling for our production is the norm and in some cases character tripling and in one case character sextupling! And in a playful twist, Jane Austen herself steps into her own story guiding us (and her nieces) through the misadventures of Emma Woodhouse and the residents of Highbury.

From the outset, I knew I wanted to embrace the rom-com energy wholeheartedly. All the ingredients were there: the spirited, flawed heroine; the will-they-won't-they tension; the embarrassing relatives; the unexpected revelations; the grand declarations of love. And of course, music – lots of music. We've incorporated an eclectic mix of songs, spanning centuries – from Elgar to the Jackson Five, to Alanis Morissette, with a dash of The Prodigy. I flatter myself that Jane Austen would have approved!

But while the comedy has been great fun (and I do hope you laugh – a lot!), we've kept sight of the warmth and wisdom at the heart of the story. Austen knew exactly what she was doing. Beneath all the banter, *Emma* is about growth, about learning to see others clearly, and about opening your heart and being brave enough to change. That message is as relevant today as it was in 1815. Maybe even more so.

And finally, a few thank-yous. To Michael and Alex for entrusting me to be the guinea pig director of The Questors' latest outdoor production – hopefully we have convinced you that it won't be the last. Thanks to The Questors' amazing marketing team Louise and Emily for embracing my modern take on *Emma*. Rob 'Tarantino' Vass for his *Reservoir Dogs* inspired trailer. Becky Hartnup for her casting match making. To my magnificent creative crew, notably Nikoleta (set) and Chloe (sound), two young designers thrown in at the deep end on an untried performance space; Emerson for his support; Freddy for her moves; Andrew and Robyn for their outdoor lights; Jenny and Helen (costume) who didn't flinch when I said Jane Austen period dress and trainers in the same sentence; and to my logistic magicians, Jane, Clare and Sarah for delivering the impossible. And lastly thank you to Priya, Caitlyn, Isabella, Sophie, Dina, Eloise, Anoop and Nick – my cast. The most playful, creative and funny ensemble actors. I have never had more fun directing a show!

We hope you enjoy yourselves!

Biographies

Isabella Cottrell Kirby – *Niece One / Miss Bates*

Isabella joined The Questors world as a teenager, graduating from Student Group 73 in 2021. Past productions include *Quietus* (Jonne Wilson), *Strange Orchestra* (Rodney Ackland) and *Trojan Barbie* (Christine Evans). She studied drama at the University of Cambridge, has written for stage, and has a weakness for all forms of comedy and beautiful costuming.

Dina Fahmy – *Niece Three / Mrs Elton / Mrs Weston*

Dina joined The Questors at the end of 2024 and *Emma* will be her first production here. She has been acting with St Michael's Players, Chiswick for a couple of years. Earlier this year, she played Bobbie in *The Railway Children*. Last year she acted in *Harvey* and *The Government Inspector*.

Sophie George – *Niece Two / Jane Fairfax / Choreographer*

Sophie trained at the Guildford School of Acting. She joined The Questors in 2024 and has since appeared in *Tom Jones*, *The Welkin* and *Boudica*. Since graduating, Sophie has also worked professionally in touring pantomime, children's theatre and, most recently, in a short run of a new play at The Network Theatre in Waterloo.

Anoop Jagan – *Frank Churchill*

Anoop became a member of The Questors in 2018 and has since been actively involved in a range of productions, including *A Doll's House* and *Rafta Rafta*. Prior to this, from the ages of 11 to 20, he was part of a cultural organisation called KALA, where he gained experience acting in front of large audiences, whilst also assisting in directing plays.

Eloise McCreedy – *Niece Four / Harriet Smith*

This is Eloise's first show with The Questors and she is delighted to be playing the role of Harriet Smith. Eloise graduated from the Victorian College of the Arts with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre and has performed at the Melbourne Fringe Festival and the Melbourne Recital Centre. Her credits include Patricia Milligan in *London Wall*, Trudi in *Apologia*, Sibyl Chase in *Private Lives*, Sonya in *Crime and Punishment*, Grace in *The Dark Room* and most recently Shirley in *Hangmen*.

Priya Patel – *Jane Austen / Mr Knightley*

Priya joined The Questors in 2023. Her previous roles here include Peg Carter in *The Welkin* (2024), Sarika Chatterjee in *The Contingency Plan* (2023) and Portia in *Julius Caesar* (2024). Previously, she acted with The Spread Eagle Players at The Bridewell. Highlights there include appearing in *Fawlty Towers* (Polly), *Sweeney Todd*, several pantomimes and *In Basildon*, which she also assistant directed.

Nick Thomas – *Mr Elton / Mr Woodhouse / Robert Martin & others*

Nick attended the Questors Youth Theatre before studying Classical Acting at the Royal Central School of Speech and Drama. Nick has appeared in several Questors productions, including *The 39 Steps* and *Equus*. This will be his first time performing outside.

Caitlyn Vary – *Emma*

Caitlyn joined Questors Youth Theatre at the age of eight and continued until the age of eighteen. Since then, she has trained at East 15 Acting School and is currently training at Drama Studio London. Caitlyn is now a teaching assistant at The Questors too! Most recent work for The Questors includes pantomimes *Robin Hood* (2019) and *Snow White* (2022), and *The Anniversary* (2025).

Robyn Backhouse – *Lighting Designer*

Normally found in the Questors Sound Department, or up in the Playhouse roof hanging in the rigging, this is Robyn's first foray into lighting design, apprenticed to Andrew Whadcoat, after designing sound for *Boudica*, *The Welkin*, *The Slaves of Solitude*, *Tom Jones* and others. She has been a member of The Questors for two years now and is always keen to try new things.

Emerson Bramwell – *Assisting Sound Designer*

Emerson most recently composed scores for *Low Level Panic*, *The Physicists* and *The Mystery of Fellstone Manor*. He also designed sound for *Apologia*, *Hangmen*, *Death and the Maiden*, *A Doll's House*, *Much Ado About Nothing*, *Arcadia*, *Albion*, *Whispers in the Wings*, *How To Disappear Completely*, *The Welkin* and *Posh*.

Helen Cooper – *Costume Designer*

Helen has been a member of The Questors since 2019. Apart from the occasional detour into writing panto lyrics, she can mostly be found in wardrobe where she has worked on costumes for *Treasure Island*, *Sara Sampson*, *The Welkin*, *Lion Boy*, *Boudica* and *My Fair Lady*.

Rachel Moorhead – *Director*

Rachel's previous directing credits with The Questors include *A Little Night Music*, *Company* and *The Shape of Things*. Other directing credits include *The Good Fight* (New Musicals Australia), *Sweeney Todd* (Adelaide College of the Arts), *Jersey Boys* (Director's Assistant Australian Tour) and *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* (4th Wall Theatre Company). She trained at the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA) – Performance Studies (Directing).

Chloe Park – Sound Designer

Chloe is a live sound engineer based in London, working across theatre and live events. She studied Music Technology and has contributed to various productions as a sound designer, sound operator and musician. Since joining The Questors in January 2025, she has worked on *Lion Boy*, *Trojan Barbie* and *Relatively Speaking*. *Emma* marks her fourth production with the company. Chloe also performed as a keyboardist in *Legally Blonde* at the University of West London.

Jenny Richardson – Costume Designer

After many years working in stage management, props and set design, Jenny enjoyed a change of direction to costume design, recently for *Under Milk Wood*, *Relatively Speaking*, *A Real Race Around the World*, *The Anniversary*, *The Cane*, *The Pillowman*, *Medea*, *The Slaves of Solitude*, *Whispers in the Wings*, *You Can't Take It With You*, *Albion*, *The Herd*, *The Contingency Plan*, *Murder on the Nile*, *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof* and *Little Dorrit*. Jenny is also frequently in demand as an upholsterer.

Freddy Sledge – Choreographer

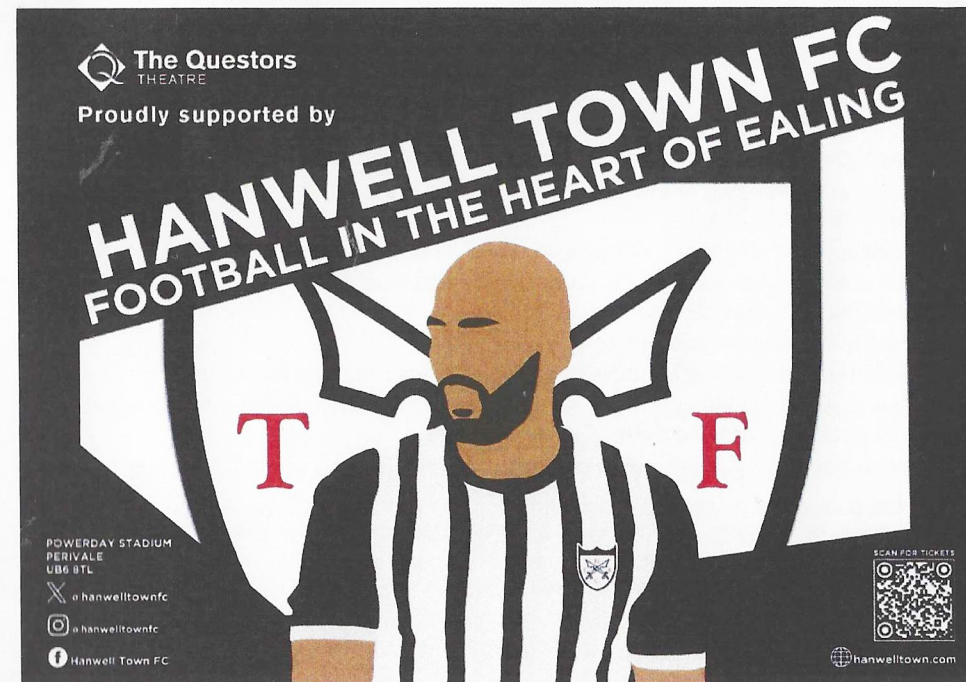
