ZXHIBITION—ROBIN CAULKETT and JOHN FIRTH

The exhibition in the Shaw Room during the run of 'Ring Round the Moon' will be in the hands of two young artists of very different technique. Robin Caulkett, who is 20 years old, a Londoner, and an inhabitant of Ealing, produces sculpture in glass, trying as he says to "emphasise the natural aesthetic value of the material, together with an expression of personal feelings". Although he also works in other media, Robin, who took up glasswork about five years ago, prefers this difficult material because of the technical challenge it presents.
