**HEN Questors** Theatre's artistic director David Emmet invited Russian director Oxana Meleshkina over to work on a production of Murray Schisgal's The Typists two years ago, it was a resounding success. Now she's back at Mattock Lane, Ealing, with her own startling interpretation of Anton Chekhov's Uncle Vanya which opens tomorrow (Saturday).

A doctor of philosophy, actress, director and artist, Oxana divides her time between Czechoslovakia and Russia, where she is artistic director of a Moscow arts centre that specialises in improvised theatre.

She formed links with Questors after meeting David Emmet in Moscow. Interviewing her with the help of a translator, Oxana said: "We don't have

idea of a club where the actors, backstage team and audience are both invovled in the theatre. I would like to see something similar set up in Russia." Oxana said theatre is flourishing in Russia despite the financial crisis. Her work with the arts centre is very avant garde, providing a chance for performers and artists from mime, music, drama and visual art to work together. She said: "Everybody gets together and participates. We don't rehearse we just get on the stage and see what develops. It seems to go down well. We took a production to Germany last year and it was very well received."

Right now her energy is concentrated on *Uncle* 

Vanya. The company is taking its production to Moscow to take part in the Chekhov Festival in August.
