

#### Introduction

This has also enabled us to form separate troupes of performers, each with their own approach, style and energy, to tell their tales in a way unique to them. The process of then placing these tales into a show together has been an interesting and organic one for everyone involved. The young people have been able to take a very active role in the creative process – figuring out how our version of this show works and feels.

Alex Marker and I were in the first ever Questors Youth Theatre Production back in 1991. *Gregory's Girl*, directed by the wonderful Peter Whelan, was a great experience for us both and clearly we feel strongly enough about the value of our precious QYT and the shows we put on that we are still here – 25 years later – actively supporting the young people here.

We do hope you enjoy this scary, silly and fantastical show!

#### Hansel and Gretel / Iron Hans

The most exciting and surprising aspect of the 'dark and scary' *Grimm Tales* is that these are the ones with the brightest, most encouraging messages.

Like the stories they tell, our 'dark and scary' storytellers seem at first the most threatening of the troupes, yet behind their ominous smiles and malevolent stares you will find a sense of humour and hope. This troupe functions telepathically, speaking aloud only when 'in character'. They are cat-like in their self-confidence and operate as a collective hive mind, like bees or (for those of us old enough to remember) Borg drones — albeit Borg drones with a 1980s Labyrinth aesthetic, my quiet salute to another storyteller and his exploration of character and identity.

For all the eventual positivity of the 'dark and scary' stories, they don't shirk from the truth that growing up and learning the lessons of life will be sometimes frightening, often painful and even dangerous. However, the deeper truth of these stories is found not when they are read literally – kill the monster before the monster kills you – but when they are read as fable: there is and always will be a darker side to human nature; aspects of ourselves which sometimes need to be vanquished, but sometimes just needs to be befriended.

'Dark and Scary' as we are, we hope the very different moods and personalities of the three troupes form a unity which celebrates performance and storytelling, life and the lessons it teaches us in all their gore and glory.

#### Ashputtel / The Lady and The Lion

When I first read *Grimm Tales* I was younger than my cast and I found them strange and appealing. Strange, because the characters were often cruel for no apparent reason, and appealing, because they were not predictable fairy tales. Looking at them many years later, I still feel the same. Dealing with stories that are both complicated and familiar is a double challenge. Just as you think you know where the story is going — along comes a plot twist to complicate it! *Ashputtel* doesn't stray too far from its descendant, but only basic remnants of *The Lady and the Lion* have survived to the modern version.

So the challenge seemed to be to create a believable world where such unpredictable stories could happen. So I went back to Nature. My first reading of *The Lady and The Lion* conjured up images of insects, so I stuck with it and developed it. Some of the images are obvious: there's a Dragon(fly) Princess, a Lady(bird), a Lion (moth); and, as various birds appear in both tales, the concept of wings neatly harmonised. Working with my troupe on a style to move around the stage and 'swarm' has been huge fun: and they have all committed to their 'insect' alter-egos with charm and panache. My heartfelt thanks to wardrobe for creating such beautiful wings to help my actors fly... Naturally, I am immensely grateful to all the creative team – the fantastical magic would not have been possible without their vision and talent.


