

MOTHER GOOSE

MOTHER GOOSE

Like all pantomimes there is a moral to the story and the moral to our story is:

Beauty & Wealth cannot bring you happiness.

It seems that The Questors has hit on a big winner with the general public – pantomimes are a great Christmas tradition. Oh yes they are! This year's *Mother Goose* is the oldest pantomime story and dates back to an ancient Greek legend about a goose that laid golden eggs. It is also one of the earliest pantomimes to be seen in Great Britain, nearly two hundred years ago. The story now is not about Heidi the goose but about Mother Goose herself.

The pantomime story as we know it today does not go back as far - it's a mere 113 years old. It was at the Drury Lane Theatre, London in 1902 that the writer J. Hickory Wood created a new pantomime especially for the leading comedian of the day - Dan Leno. When the pantomime was finished it told the story that we know today, and created the biggest part for a Dame in any pantomime.

It tells how Mother Goose is about to be thrown off her land because she cannot pay the Baron the rent. Once he learns about Heidi and her golden egg laying, he plans to capture her for himself.

Mother Goose loves Heidi as a friend but doesn't know that she has been sent by the good fairy to help Mother Goose. When Heidi lays golden eggs, and Mother Goose is rich, along comes Smorg, our baddie troll, who has made a bet with the good fairy. Smorg claims there is no-one on earth who is happy with what they have got. No-one is content; they want more. The fairy disagrees, and uses Mother Goose as an example of goodness.

Then Smorg tempts Mother Goose with the one thing she doesn't have – youth and beauty. She persuades her to give her Heidi in exchange for a visit to the Bog of Beauty. Mother Goose signs Heidi away and enters the bog, emerging as (she thinks) a beautiful woman.

Her family and friends don't like her now; they want the old Mother Goose back. Too late she realises that beauty is NOT everything, and that she must get Heidi back no matter what. After a lot of trouble, she goes to Goose Court in Magic Mountain to plead for Heidi, gets her back and all ends happily ever after.

That's it in a nutshell but with lots of crazy characters, fun, laughs and boo's as we take you along for the ride.

Oh no, it isn't – oh yes, it is!

The audience participation experience draws from old Victorian music hall conventions, and it is such a key part to the panto experience that the audience is like another character in the show, keeping everyone in the cast on their toes. You are encouraged to boo and hiss at our villain Smorg (she loves it), cheer our hero and, of course, outdo each other in our singalong.

I must mention Ben Crocker who wrote this amazing script. Ben comes from a very theatrical background; his father was the actor and pantomime script writer, John Crocker. Ben saw his first panto at the tender age of three, which he recalls as being *Jack and the Beanstalk*, although he can't remember it all as he spent most of the time hiding under his seat. Pantomime is in his blood and he has continued to enjoy his love of this art form. He would say that his scripts are the best panto scripts in the world – oh yes they are!

And while we're talking about the best, I'd like to mention my talented Assistant Director, Annabelle Williams. Without her I would never have been able to get through the craziness that is this panto. She has been there right from the moment Anne Neville (our Artistic Director) asked if I would like Annabelle as my assistant. How lucky was I? Even before we started rehearsals, we could not stop coming up with ideas of how we were going to entertain you.

Annabelle's ability to re-write the songs to fit the show, her creative input in the whole process and special talent for keeping me sane has made her a joy to work with. So I'd like to say a very big thank you to her. I am looking forward to watching her tread the boards (did I say she is an actor too) in Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* as Puck later in our season in the Judi Dench Playhouse. I can't wait to see her in this production in what I consider a perfect role for her. Break a leg!

I would also like to thank all the creative team and backstage crew without whom we as a community theatre would not be able to stage these magnificent shows. Thank you all for your commitment and your input into the whole process.

We have had so much fun in our rehearsal period, we hope you have just as much fun watching and joining in. We would all like to wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Biographies

Emmy Cam – Fairy Aurora

Despite being a part of numerous theatre productions whilst growing up, including *Romeo and Juliet*, *A Christmas Carol* and *God of Carnage*, this is Emmy's first theatrical involvement with The Questors and her very first pantomime.

Alan Chambers - The Grand High Snow Goose

Alan has acted in or directed the Questors Christmas show since the sixties. His favourite roles were Albert the Horse in *The Wind in the Willows* and a Polar Bear in *The Snow Queen*. A founder member of our affiliated Pitshanger Poets, his pamphlet *Making the Moon* is on sale now in aid of the Questors Renewal Fund. Alan recently retired from the Board of Trustees after about 50 years' service.

James Goodden - Mother Goose

This is the second time that James has donned the frocks and the wigs at The Questors following his appearance as Dame Trott in *Jack and the Beanstalk* in 2014. James has been a member for over thirty years and outside of panto was most recently seen in *The Country Wife* and *The Crucible*.

Eamon Goodfellow - Gonk

Eamon is an actor and stand-up comedian who performs with a number of theatres in the south-east. He has appeared at The Questors as Robert in *Boeing-Boeing* and Malvolio in *Twelfth Night*. He loves playing Gonk as he's a loveable, gormless, loyal servant to the Baron who can really bust some moves!

Shaan Latif-Shaikh – Puppet Maker / Boss Snowman / Ensemble
At The Questors, Shaan has helped out in various departments though
commonly ends up with puppets. His previous creations include an
egotistical mouse, a sentient sausage, some neon sea creatures, three
completely different pigs and a decapitating wolf. Outside of The Questors
he works as a puppeteer with the Little Angel Theatre.

Elizabeth Ledwith - Freya Goose

Elizabeth, often known as Lily, has been a member of QYT for 11 years, and has appeared in previous Questors Christmas shows including; *Annie* as an orphan, *Aladdin and his Wonderful Lamp* and *Jack and the Beanstalk* as a chorus member. This is her first Questors show in a lead role.

Zoë Ledwith-Hoult - Heidi Goose

Zoë has supported The Questors since 2003, with her children attending youth theatre classes and participating in various shows (requiring chaperoning and costume repairs). Zoë actually works in theatre, but as a Staff Nurse. This is her second Questors Christmas panto with her daughter, Elizabeth.

Andrea Little - Postman / Ensemble

Andrea was in the Christmas panto *Dick Whittington & His Cat* at The Questors and has also been in various stage productions with other groups, operated sound and lighting as well as designing lighting. She is also a member of a film school.

Maddy MacConnol - Sven

Maddy is very excited to be performing in *Mother Goose*. Having only recently become an acting member, this is her first performance at The Questors. Maddy has previously performed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival as Madame Diafoirus in the five-star reviewed adaptation of Molière's *The Hypochondriac* and played Cha Cha in *Grease*.

Julia Marques - Smorg

Apart from other pantomimes, Julia has been in plays such as *Stepping Out*, *The Importance of Being Earnest* and *Steel Magnolias*. She has just finished an MA degree in Climate Change, and is currently teaching and working in Ealing library.

Kevin Sebastianpillai - Clock / Ensemble

An active Questors member since 2009, Kevin has worked on over a dozen shows, predominantly backstage plus music composition. He has recently ventured on stage for *Dick Whittington & His Cat, Twelfth Night* and *Pygmalion*. Previously he was part of Youth Action Theatre at Hampton Hill Playhouse.

Derek Stoddart – Baron von Rumpensmakka

Derek has acted in a wide range of productions over the last 30 years with The Questors. He loves Christmas shows and the chance to interact with the audience. He was last seen as King Bertram in *Jack and the Beanstalk* and before that as Bob Cratchit in *A Christmas Carol*. Other recent productions include *Burnt by the Sun*, *Twelfth Night*, *Uncle Vanya* and *House & Garden*.

Claire Auvache - Set Designer

Claire graduated from RADA in 2010 and worked as a stage manager until 2013 when she became a designer and art director for TV, and a prop supervisor for theatre, for which she has had many professional credits.

Andrew Dixon – Lighting Designer

Andrew has been lighting for 60 years... from amateur dramas to BBC epics; he finds them all equally exciting. His role on this panto is mainly to ensure that we have three lighting operators for each performance!

Carla Evans - Costume Designer

Carla has been making frocks, props, puppets and very silly headdresses for Questors pantomimes since 2013. This is her first production as a Costume Designer, and thanks to the support of the wonderful wardrobe team she quite likes the idea of doing it again...

John Hennessy - Musical Director

This is John's third Questors production. He has supported major acts like Dire Straits, Queen and Motörhead, plus opening the 1981 Reading Festival. Latterly, he has worked on musicals at theatres from The Questors to the West End including *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *Guys and Dolls* and many more. He has conducted *Joseph* and *Smokey Joe's Café*, recently composing the music for a play on Jesus Christ's life.

Claire Malyon - Costume Designer

This is Claire's largest production for The Questors since joining, although she has assisted on four previous Christmas shows. It has been delightful working with Carla as co-designer and huge thanks go to all the loyal wardrobe assistants.

Chris Newall - Lighting Designer




Julia Timmons - Choreographer
